My Journey Through University

Pardon the cliché

As a young girl growing up, I was always interested in nursing. I went through secondary school finding education a challenge also because I had some health issues my mother did not encourage me in pursuing this path but, I continued to make applications to various Trust but was never successful. Over time I gave up saying "I like nursing, but nursing doesn't like me".

Years went by and I gave up trying, instead I ventured into other areas of care e.g., childminding, residential care with children & young people and residential care home for the elderly. I went on to work in the Hospital Setting (Acute), it was here I was inspired to pursue nursing again. After making enquiries I applied to college to join their Access to Nursing Programme and went on to apply to universities undergraduate programme.

I experienced a lot of challenges academically and personally. During the start of the 2nd year, I found my daughters father dead and in the month of December both my mother and father died within 24 days of each other. Though it was hard I continued, I remember during a Anatomy and Physiology lessons hearing the lecturer explaining the processes certain organs of the body

go through affected emotionally but I continued with the course. I have a principle that I stand by and encourage to adapt this, I like to finish whatever I've started. With the Prayers and encouragements of family, friends, and supporters I stayed the course and I have finished the Undergraduate Adult Nursing programme (with Honours) and awaiting my Pin (registration) from the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to officially work as a qualified Nurse.



Greetings to the Bibleway Family

I have been a member of Rhema Church Ministries since the 1970's and have held various roles within my local church such as Sunday School Teacher, member of the trustee's board, and doing a lot of the administration work as necessary.

I have also been involved with the young people's choir regional and national. Secretary to the missionary's department, coordinator for registration at national convocation, secretary to the national planning committee for national convocation, and also assisted with registration at the midland's convocations.

In 2007 I took early retirement, and wondered how I was going to manage, but God has been faithful. I took some time out to rest and recharge and then decided to volunteer at my local citizen advice bureau. I did the training and qualified as a generalist adviser. I also worked as a trainee debt adviser during this time. After some years I had to give it up as I was unable to continue to do two days per week due to my caring responsibilities.

After a short break I volunteered at the Wimbledon Foodbank assisting where necessary and gave that up just before lockdown.

I am an advocate for my brother David who lives in a care home and a carer for my dad who is over 100 years old.

I am now managing my finances a lot better and decided to do a Christian Against Poverty money course in July last year which I found very beneficial. I recently did a Budget Coach training course with Community Money Advice which is also a Christian Charity.

I am now able to assist anyone, who would like to take control of their finance by doing income and expenses and depending on the result, help them to set up a budget or signpost them to the charities that gives free debt advice.

This is something that I am passionate about and believe that if I am able to help even one person, it would all have been worth it.

I am a mother of 3 children, 2 of which are teenagers. I am a social worker, in the mental health field that specialises in psychosis, I have worked in this team since 2017.

Hidden Treasure – Valerie Ayton

Taking that eternal step to walk with God is one of the most precious and important decisions we may ever make in this lifetime. Being saved during the pandemic, when the world had ceased to function as normal, allowed many the opportunity to think and ponder about what was happening around them. Valerie started her journey with the Lord on 9th October 2021, having reached a point where she realised that “God had a purpose for [her] and all [she] needed to do was trust him and follow his directions”.

Every journey in life that we embark upon presents crossroads, diversions, road blocks and difficulties. Valerie’s journey has also been the same, facing challenges such as parenting, non-believing family members/ friends and communication issues. However, she has set her heart and mind to overcome the negative messages that she may repeat over and over to herself, all of which are untrue. Counter acting this by continually praying and asking for the negative messages to be removed and replaced with positive thoughts

and Godly affirmations. She has chosen to maintain a daily journal where she can offload all of her thoughts and re-evaluate them on a regular basis. Her words of encouragement to those who are yet to give their lives to God is “Do it without any hesitation, you will see significant changes occur and you will no longer feel any fear. Your life will be transformed”.

Since joining Life Tabernacle Fellowship, she has shared through presentations her passion for maintaining and encouraging Healthy living. When asked what has influenced this focus she explains “We tend to put others first, but God wants us to put ourselves first and ensure that we are eating nutritious foods, exercising and having a well-balanced life style”. Proverbs 13:25 says A righteous man eats until his heart's content or eats enough to satisfy his appetite.

Here are some tips Valerie has outlined to assist us all in maintaining a healthy lifestyle.

1. Keep a food diary and note down all you eat so you can examine it and make changes to your food intake.
2. Drink plenty of water, about 2 litres daily.
3. Get out and exercise, any movement that will allow your heart to beat faster. Good forms of exercise include swimming, walking (10k steps a day) and cycling.
4. If you mess up, do not stress...start afresh tomorrow.
5. Get more sleep it helps to zap your stress.

Valerie has shown us that we all have hidden treasures within that God wants us to share with others. When God calls us into an assembly he has identified specific skills, knowledge and abilities that allows the body to be fitly joined together. As each part does its own special work, it helps the other parts to grow, so that the whole body is healthy and growing and full of love” Ephesian 4:16. (New Living Translation)

There is so much more that God will bless us with through her, stay faithful and diligent in the works of God.
