Journey to England

Mother Smith finished her schooling and eventually moved to Montego Bay, to train and work as a caterer at a family member's cafeteria. It was whilst she was training and working here, that her mother received a letter from Bishop Smith, who had travelled to Hitchin in England to join his older brother Sydney who had established himself with work and a home there. In this letter was a proposal for Mother Smith to become his wife and a request that her mother would give him her own permission for the marriage if he was accepted by Mother Smith, when he later asked her. All of this was unbeknown to Mother Smith herself!

Mother Smith accepted his proposal of marriage and arrived in The United Kingdom in April 1962.

Married Life

Bishop and Mother Smith lived with Bishop's brother at first; this enabled them to save up a deposit to buy their own home in Hitchin in 1966. Mother Smith continues to live here to this day.

The Early Days of The Church in Hitchin

Bishop and Mother Smith started The Built on Faith Apostolic Church on the 28th October 1962 after a surprise visit of mother Jean White, to Sis Winifred and Elder Clement Bucknor, Bishop Smith's sister's home. This became the 2nd established church of The Bibleway U.K organisation.

Ministry at Home and in The Community

Mother Smith is a mother to 8 children. Mother Smith adopted her son John as a baby following the death of his mother in Jamaica, before her marriage. She and Bishop Smith went on to have another 7 children in Britain. She worked nights as a Care Assistant in a Local Psychiatric hospital and Bishop Smith worked locally in Hitchin during the day, so that they could manage the care and upbringing of their children together.

Mother Smith whilst being a homemaker for her husband and children, also childminded so many, children in the community, the number cannot be counted.

She was a Mother to The Church, a Master Chef, A Carer of the sick in the Community and a Prayer Warrior.

Ministry in The Church

Ministry in Church

Mother Smith fulfilled many different roles in the Church. She taught the Sunday school, worked and exhorted as a missionary, helped cook for Regional Convocation and cooked for visiting preachers and saints who turned up at church. Her pots always had enough for unexpected guests, as well as her family and friends.

Ministry in the Community

She physically nursed and cared for the sick and the infirm in their homes. She cooked for the vulnerable brethren, supplying them with her famous rice and peas and chicken. She supplied them with enough in quantity for Sunday and the week ahead.

Ministry in Song

She taught the church and the choir songs from all the hymnals available (Pentecostal Hymnal, Church Hymnal, Songs of Joy, Sankey's hymnal etc) She loves singing and has a large deposit of songs stored in her memory.

Ministry as a Prayer Warrior

Mother Smith has held a Tuesday Noon day Prayer meeting in the family home since the early days. Many people have been saved, filled, healed and delivered in these prayer meetings. These meetings continue to this day in her sitting room in her home.

Conclusion- Her Legacy

- Mother Smiths' legacy continues in the lives and testimonies of the saints in Hitchin.
- In her Good Name and reputation, in the Hitchin Community.
- In her home and children and grandchildren and all the children she has cared for over the many years of service to them.

BLACK LIVES MATTER TOO...

2020 the year we will never forget! First there was the worldwide epidemic - The Corona virus. Then the world was shaken by the heartless horrific scene of the killing of George Floyd on 25 May in Minneapolis USA. The video showed George, a black man, lying on the ground, crying, and begging for help while a white American police officer knelt forcibly on his neck for over 8 minutes until he could no longer breath. Those immortal words: "I can't breathe" were shouted on the streets of the US, UK, Australia, and numerous countries all over the world, displaying the slogan 'Black Lives Matter'.

The appalling action or rather inaction of Officer Chauvin, to the cries of George Floyd: 'I can't breathe' shocked everyone and raised the issue of Police brutality and institutional racism worldwide. The subsequent marches and protests demanded that 'Black Lives Matter' causing organisations, public bodies, Charities and Churches to examine themselves, engage in dialogue and review their practices to consider in what ways they have discriminated against black people consciously or unconsciously. It was time to have those difficult conversations.

Black and White majority churches started to talk about the issues. For some of the older generations who took up the invitation to come to the UK in the late 50's and 60's from the Caribbean, the Black Lives Matter conversations reminded them of their experiences when they first arrived to the unfriendly notices: 'No Blacks, No Irish & No dogs!'. Yes, back then it hurt, but it was not going to deter them from their purpose i.e. to work in the UK for 2 or 3 years, save hard and then return back to the Caribbean. The white churches did not welcome them, so they formed their own assemblies with the Church

providing spiritual guidance and fellowship as well as a place to build networks, form friendships and support. They would laugh because their short-term plans overtime became long-term with many deciding to make England their permanent home. Racism is bad but 'heaven is my home' and England gave them some opportunities they would not have had if they had not left the Caribbean. They had white neighbours, work colleagues and managers who they got on with and treated them well.

Conversations with the young people in our UK Churches and communities was quite different. They were incensed, took to the streets to protest, wore the Black Lives Matter T-shirts, and expressed their views strongly. They marched alongside many of their white peers. Our young people have no plans to return to the Caribbean and were not prepared to put up with racism temporarily like their Windrush generation grandparents did. No, the UK is their home, they have their future ahead of them and they want to see changes now for themselves and future generations to come.

Jesus said in Matthew 22 verse 39 '... Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself'. Also, in the Gospel of Luke chapter 10, we read of the parable of the Good Samaritan. Jesus tells of a man who is robbed, beaten, and left for dead by the side of the road. A priest and a Levite, good religious people who his hearers would have expected to be the heroes of the story, pass by the wounded man. It is a distrusted foreigner who stops and helps the man, going against everyone's expectations. Jesus ends his parable with a question, "Who was neighbour to this man?" When the answer comes back to him, "It was the one who showed him mercy," Jesus simply responds, "Go and do likewise."

As God's people we must stand with all people that suffer injustice but at this time in particular black people, sharing in sorrow and outrage when lives are stolen by those who have sworn to protect and serve our communities. I would like to think that officers such as Derek Chauvin are in the minority with the majority of Police officers, committed to doing right within our communities. However, in addressing the cries of victims like George Floyd, we need to call for accountability from the Police and insist on policies, procedures but more importantly practices that seek to address racism and to prevent it from turning deadly again.
