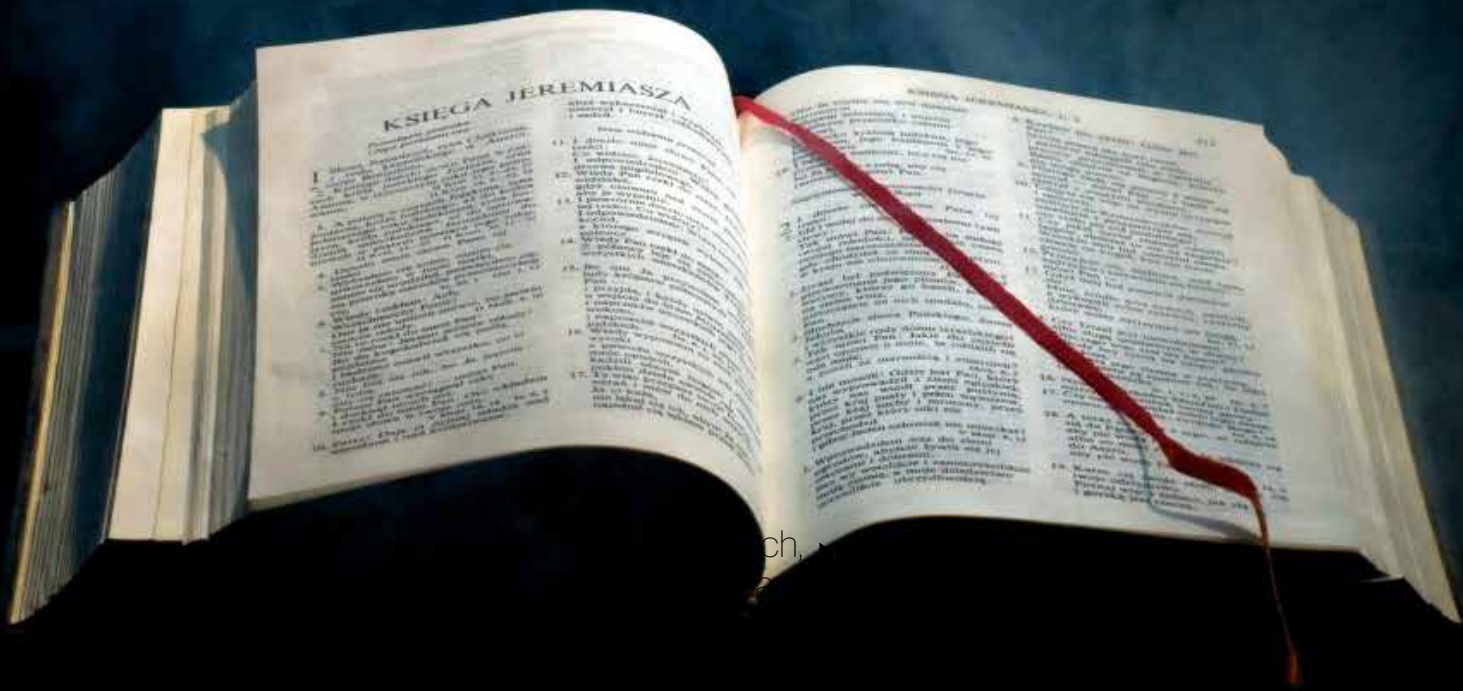

Mentoring Across Generations — Gen Z, Gen Alpha, and Emerging Beta

Let Us Continue the Fire Without Changing The Flame

Scripture foundation:
"Revival as Fire, and our
Responsibility to the Next
Generation"

Revival is not a fleeting emotion; it is a generational inheritance. As leaders we are called to ensure the fire of the Gospel continues unaltered while guiding each generation in ways that resonate with their context "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, today and forever" Hebrews 13:8 (KJV). This does not mean we change the message, but we change the method, for example the apostle Paul spoke differently to Jews than he did to Greeks, and in Acts of the Apostles 17, he spoke to Philosophers using their cultural references, the same truth but different approaches.

The flame represents Christ Himself, constant and transformative, yet the expression of His truth adapts to time, culture, and experience. God's Word remains relevant for the past, present, and future. "Our responsibility is to maintain this flame while equipping the next generation to carry it faithfully. Even as cultural shifts and generational traumas shape their worldview

God's word continues to provide guidance, answers, and enduring truth."

1. Anchor the Next Generation in Scripture

The foundation of intergenerational revival is Scripture. Gen Z is referred to as a revival generation, and Gen Alpha are spiritually curious and searching for meaning, yet they are constantly exposed to competing ideologies digital narratives and shifting definitions of truth. Emerging Gen Beta will inherit unprecedented levels of hyper-connected, artificial realities and global influence, climate-adaptive societies, thus immersed in culturally saturated environments but the question remains.

Who does God say we are?

God declares that we are a chosen Generation 1 Peter 2:9 (KJV) A Royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's Own possession, The light of the world, the salt of the Earth.

"Continue in the things which thou hast learned... from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures." 2 Timothy 3:14-15 (KJV).

We Leaders and families must

continue:

- To teach systematic Bible study alongside inspirational messages.
- Encourage questioning that leads back to Scripture.
- Model decision-making rooted in the Word.
- Create intergenerational Bible study environments.
- Encourage youth to lead prayer sessions and bible studies
- Ensure we, as leaders, lead and mentor by example, engage in authentic worship. Gen Z and upcoming generation spot the difference and call it out.

Revival without Scriptural grounding risks emotional enthusiasm; revival rooted in Scripture produces lasting transformation.

2. Strengthen Intergenerational Mentorship to effectively Bridge The Gap

Faith is transmitted relationally, not programmatically. Psalm 78 models deliberate storytelling of God's works to the next generation. Older believers must engage authentically with youth adopting the Bereans demonstration - a noble way of studying...

"These were more noble than those in Thessalonica... and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so." — Acts 17:11 (KJV)

Practical approaches we can use:

- Structured mentorship programs.
- Shared ministry experiences (worship, outreach, service, youth camps, Activities).
- Storytelling of testimonies from older saints.
- Safe spaces for difficult questions.
- Nonjudgmental approach
- Models Christlike Leadership

As leaders, we must birth future mentors, creating a triad of humility, encouragement, and continuity.

3. Ensuring Youth Feel at Home in Their Home Ministries

Research shows youth often leave their home churches despite strong spiritual foundations. Lack of ownership, voice, and intergenerational connection contributes to this. As leaders we must create environments where youth feel at home:

- Active participation in leadership and decision-making.
- Mentoring to birth mentors.
- Intergenerational integration: shared worship, service, and Bible study.
- Experiential discipleship: hands-on ministry linking faith to action.
- Cultural and personal relevance: addressing contemporary issues transparently.
- Affirming gifts and identity to instil belonging and confidence

By nurturing youth like the Bereans engaging Scripture critically under mentorship, we secure revival for present and emerging generations.

4. Integrate Youth into Existing Ministries

Research by Powell and Clark (2011) identified patterns that affects whether faith “sticks” beyond adolescence. The research found that intergenerational relationship strengthen faith and authenticity. Parallel youth programs may risk disconnected faith; the church is one body, and integrating services fosters maturity, encouraging families to model faith through everyday practices rather than formal instruction.

Integration strategies:

- Involve youth in leadership early by identifying their calling, mentor them before appointing to avoid them feeling pressured.
- Pair younger leaders with experienced mentors.

- Include youth voices in decision-making within our ministries.
- Encourage shared worship across generations in one space whenever possible.
- Ask them to prepare and run a supervised service and request they invite a friend.

Youth ownership in home ministries deepens commitment and positions them to advance God’s work.

5. Cultivate Experiential Discipleship

Faith must be applied, not theorized. Jesus sent His disciples to minister (Luke 9–10). This practice is seen in many ministries already and prove to be successful.

Experiential discipleship includes:



- Hands-on ministry.
- Community outreach and mission engagement.
- Encounter-focused prayer gatherings.
- Service projects applying biblical teaching.

It fosters authenticity a key hunger of modern youth.

6. Guard Doctrine While Engaging Culture

Youth live in a digitally saturated, ideologically diverse world. Paul warns: “See to it that no man deceives you by philosophy and vain deceit... and not after Christ.” — Colossians 2:8 (KJV)

As leaders we ought to:

- Continue to teach core doctrines clearly as currently practised in our home ministries.
- Equip youth to discern cultural messages biblically.
- Address contemporary ethical issues openly.
- Model respectful engagement without compromise.
- Normalize Repentance and Spiritual Formation

Because Gen Z is referred to the revival generation, revival requires ongoing formation. As leaders must model humility and remain non-judgmental, even as culture shifts. “Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me.” Psalm 51:10 (KJV)

- Model humility and transparency.
- Encourage confession and accountability.
- Provide confidential pastoral care for mental and emotional health.

Normalizing repentance fosters authentic, Spirit-led faith across generations.

7. Affirming Identity and Calling

Young people need to hear:

- “I see you.”
 - “You matter.”
 - “You are called.”
 - “God is working in you.”
- Affirmation builds confidence and empowers youth to become future mentors, fulfilling 2 Timothy 2:2.

8. Understanding Generational Contexts

Each generation carries unique traits, traumas, and leadership needs. Effective ministry requires understanding these differences and responding with wisdom, compassion, and intentionality.

Passing the Fire Forward

Revival is sustained when the church intentionally combines:

- Scripture
- Mentorship
- Experiential discipleship
- Doctrinal clarity
- Intergenerational integration
- Identity affirmation

This is the generational relay of revival: One generation receives the promise. One protects it. One multiplies it. And the next carries it forward. “One generation shall commend thy works unto another.” — Psalm 145:4

A dying art or an essential blessing?

Last year the Lord asked us to put time aside in our diary to restart the Pre-marriage and marriage course and sure enough couples applied faster than we imagined. Some were in London and other parts of the UK, and some were as far away as South Africa.

Thanks to Zoom!

The Marriage course for those who haven't heard, is a 5 to 7-week course where couples invest in their marriage or pre-marriage for engaged couples. This is online but can be in person. It's not just for church members but is open to members of the public

as well.

You each have a journal which costs approximately £5.

Over a decade ago we did this course, and we have been married nearly 33 years. We didn't have much in the way of marriage counselling however, many couples that were married at the same time as us are sadly no longer together.

We decided to do the course because it has great tools that help you understand your spouse and give you time and space to share and appreciate one another in the different seasons of your marriage.

We invest in our house, a car, children and education so why don't we invest in our marriages not just financially but with our time. We need to understand that many couples will spend a fortune on the wedding day and an exorbitant amount on divorce settlements, but it is what you do in between that makes the difference and changes the whole way marriage is perceived.

In this church era it is important that we don't just pray for married couples but also offer support and opportunities for the question of marriage to be looked at again in the way God intended.

There should be three people in the marriage: the husband the wife and God.

We need to pass on an inheritance to our children that is grounded in not just love but trust, respect, and a willingness to learn about marriage and all it entails so that opting out is not an option because we have worked at it and are learning how to invest the necessary tools and time needed.

God hates divorce; it says so

in His Word (Malachi 2:16). There are rare exceptions of course, but the commitment made on our wedding day should be as the vows say, "till death do us part". It is eternal. Even my own parents, who did not have a faith, would not divorce. They were separated for many years, but it was only death that ended their marriage vows.

Marriages dropped from 400,000 in 1973 to 224,402 in 2023. It's time to decree and declare marriages to be fireproof.

Bibleway Children & Youth Ministry — Youth Congress 2026

On Friday 3rd April 2026, the young people once again led the national convoy to West Mill Community Centre in Hitchin, where they hosted the Bibleway Children & Youth Ministry Youth Congress. The months that preceded it were marked by prayer, planning, and shared purpose. The national youth officers and young people worked side by side, forming a truly all-generation committee, dedicated to the development of every aspect of the gathering.

Inspired by God, the theme — "It's Time for an Encounter," drawn from 2 Kings 22:1–2 — laid the foundation for children and young people to

learn about and experience the God of all ages. Our vision was clear: not simply to host an event, but to equip our young people to walk in the Word of God in their everyday lives — to be disciples, not just attendees.

The facilitators taught how God honours and elevates those who, in their childhood and youth, put their trust in His Word. Young King Josiah, who broke cultural and generational behaviours that led people away from God, became the picture of what the Lord still does through the young today.

God spoke to children, young people, and adults through every activity, allowing them to challenge themselves in

their beliefs and to demonstrate their faith in action. When setbacks arose, the response was spontaneous praise and worship — and the presence of God took control. The wisdom of the young was on display.

Through well-designed workshops, they learned how God positioned a young child — Josiah, at just eight years old — to bring His people back into true fellowship and worship of the living God. The message was clear: obedience to God's Word matters more than the popular trends of the day. And our youngest children were enabled to experience being kings for a day, parading in their gold crowns as they gave thanks.

It was a time of shared intergenerational worship. The young inspired and reinvigorated the energies of their elders. It was empowered family worship.

God in His divine wisdom also raised up new leadership for the BCYM, in the persons of Bro. Daniel Thomas and Min. Asher Smith. Like Joshua and Caleb — young leaders trusted with a generational mission — they bring real skill and clear vision. They are flanked by a team of active, inspirational, and professional officers, and by young people who do not allow their youth to be a hindrance, but an asset, to their service to God.

Songs like Omemma lifted the room into the presence of God as we worshipped in spirit and in dance. Young men and women displayed their oratory gifts in the exhortation of the Word, in

scripture reading, and in song. There was artistic expression of what God is doing in their lives. The young doorkeepers were a beautiful display of active service in the house. Words of encouragement and scriptures were proudly emblazoned on t-shirts — and they looked good! Truly, the Spirit of the Lord was there, and the whole house pulsated with the magnetic power of the Holy Ghost.

It was an unrepeatable, unforgettable experience — and yet the BCYM knows that God has not finished with them yet. Like Josiah, more lies ahead for those young people who choose to worship God in Spirit and in truth. What the Spirit ignited continued on the journey home, and into homes, as families recollected the experience of the day. The fire is burning. The officers are praying that the encounter continues — back in local

churches, and out into the communities. The BCYM is a light we want to shine wherever it goes.

Building on the strengths of BCYM 2025, this year prepared our children and young people for battle-readiness and victory in every area of their lives. The Bibleway children and young people are on the move.

Following the BCYM presentation at the AGM on Saturday 9th May 2026, the journey continues to the National Convocation, 23rd—25th May 2026, where Bro Daniel and Min. Asher will be prayed for as they step formally into their roles. Under the mentorship of Lady Sandra Copeland, Youth Director, they are ready for the task of leading the BCYM into a new era of spiritual expression and the manifestation of the power of God.

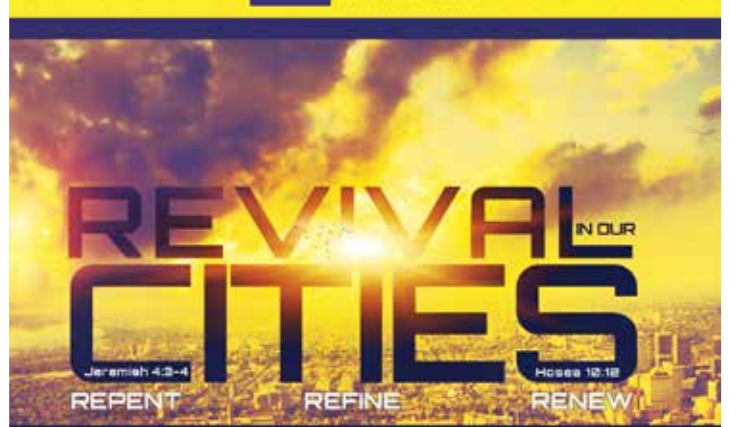
