

A day in the life of a Foster Carer

Each day there must be an ethos of routine, discipline and purpose. me time to meditate. One of the repeating themes whilst training, as a Foster Carer is Snacks and lunch are prepared by to give easy and stable routine in the life of the foster child.

Routine... My first thoughts are usually towards the foster child in my home at the time. I am always ahead of the game by looking at what is happening the next day by either checking my emails or diary the night before; this is so that I do not miss any important meetings or appointments. So essentially the preparatory work starts in my mind the night before.

On waking I usually check that my child or young person is ok, and they have had a good night. This I do by either knocking or entering the room depending on the age and ability of the child or young person.

With my current young person, I prepare all the bathroom items for morning shower or bath, and clothes. Once washed and dressed, I prepare a light breakfast and clean up the kitchen and bathroom whilst she's eating.

The next couple of hours are usually spent cleaning up the home and doing the laundry. Over the past year I have also factored in some time for a walk; a form of

exercise I enjoy, and it also gives

mid-morning and throughout the day I will read, check my emails, attend any booked on-line training and deal with several phone calls.

After 3pm I will turn my thoughts to an afternoon snack and dinner which is always served with a dessert.

The child or young person in my care will always have three meals a day: breakfast, lunch and dinner, plus snacks throughout the day. Some children may be coming from a place of neglect, and food plays a big part of their lives and so we try to ensure that they have a balanced diet and encourage a varied diet with healthy choices where possible.

Bedtime has its own specific routine this is to help give the child or young person routine and discipline.

Every child matters and we try to encourage positive creativity.

Once my children or young person is settled in their room for bed, I will spend some time reading, praying and meditating.

IPSWICH CHURCH PLANT 1984

Memories of Pastor Helen Brown

My name is Helen Brown. I grew up in Cambridge until I was eighteen when I got married and moved to Bedford where I have been ever since.

When I was in Cambridge, I belonged to a thriving Pentecostal church which was part of the Bibleway organisation. I was very involved from a young age and we, the congregation, were always encouraged to get into evangelising the gospel. This included singing as a choir in the town centre, door knocking and personal evangelism.

In the summer of 1984, when I was thirteen, I went to stay at my friend Mandy Tylka's house in Ipswich for three weeks during the summer holidays. Mandy and I grew up together as best friends in Cambridge where she also received Jesus into her life. Mandy moved to Ipswich, when we were about twelve years old, and we remained very close friends.

That summer we had a great time catching up and having fun. One day Mandy said she was going to take me to meet some friends. We went to a house in Hervey Street, where a group of about eight young people were sitting and talking in the living room. I recognised Penny, Lucy, Marcus, and Julian as they used to live in Cambridge in the building next door to my church, the Midland Tavern pub, 1 Devonshire Road, Cambridge. I remember us getting into a conversation about Jesus and salvation. Both myself and Mandy used this opportunity to evangelise the gospel as best as we knew how. I knew the Holy Spirit had started something in the hearts of these young people and felt excited to go back to Cambridge and tell my Mum and Pastor.

After my wonderful time spent in Ipswich, both Mandy and I travelled back to Cambridge together. Mandy came to my house and then went on to stay with her Nan who also lived in Cambridge, for the remainder of the school holidays.

We explained our experience with my mum who was so happy, not just because of what we had done but she also remembered Penny, Lucy, Julian, and Marcus as small children when they lived in Cambridge. I mentioned that we needed to arrange for my mum and our Pastor to go back to Ipswich and have a prayer meeting with our friends, they agreed and within a couple of weeks, they did just that.

My mum, Pastor Williams and other missionaries would go to Ipswich on a weekly basis, to continue evangelising. The group of believers was growing fast!

I remember going back to Ipswich a few times over the next few months with my mum, my Pastor, and other missionaries from Cambridge: Missionary Taaf, Missionary Miller and Missionary Williams, to have prayer meetings. We would go to the home of one of the older ladies who later became quite prominent in Ipswich church. I brought my guitar and played to the songs; Mandy was there also.

The church was established in Ipswich with Pastor and Missionary Williams as the initial Pastors until Pastor and Missionary Bent were then installed as resident Pastors early 1985.






Memories from Pastor Ivylyn Mullings, Pastor Helen's mum

Most people were involved after the groundwork was done. Pastor Williams started it and then Mother Miller and I stayed at Penny and Lucy's house and continued until there were a few people to start the church then Elder Bent took over and people started going to support the work. Mother Miller and I rode our bikes up and down Nacton Road knocking on doors. We were blessed to have stayed with Penny and Lucy at that time and really enjoyed the work in Ipswich. It had its challenges, but we were happy to be in the service of the Lord. Praise God the church is still standing.



Memories from Pastor Penny Gordon

I had moved from Cambridge to Ipswich in February 1982 with my mum, sister and two brothers. In October 1983, our mum died in a tragic road accident and our world became very bleak. I was 16, my sister Lucy 15, my brother's Julian and Marcus were 13 and 11. In the summer of 1984, my siblings and I were all together in our home in Hervey Street when Helen and Mandy came to visit and shared the gospel with us. Julian and Marcus became part of the youth department in the Bibleway church in Cambridge and once the Ipswich branch opened, Lucy and I began attending. In these early years, the church helped to hold us together as a family and we enjoyed being part of the national, regional, and local choirs. It was a vibrant and exciting time for us as young people and our faith has been an anchor in our lives ever since.



Stepping into Volunteering



I have always volunteered in one capacity or another. Recently I was delivering a session at work and realised I have done at least 17 different types and there are even more as my first volunteering started when I was just 11 years old with St John Ambulance. Every step has been orchestrated by God of course, I did not know that then.

People are the heartbeat of whatever the Lord led me into, from helping at schools that my children attended to Sure Start to Governors.

One of the gifts God has given me is networking, Joshua 1: 3 wherever my feet tread I will take territory. I just make myself available and the Lord puts me in the right place at the right time and everything connects.

We have moved many times as a family and so we have lived in different communities and understand the enormous difficulties people face as I have

experienced many of these in my own life.

God just directs my path. However, you must be willing to step out of your comfort-zone.

I volunteered as a children's worker at a homeless lodge in Aylesbury and ended up getting funding and being offered a job. This was my first experience of working for a church organisation and it all started with volunteering. One of our greatest I was in a Domestic Violence times of ministry. Offering your time is an essential

part of getting the most out of volunteering. Understanding trading cash for your time is not the mindset you need to have. I would say it is what you can learn from this experience and how you ministry which is definitely can make a difference.

I have been a Hope UK Drug Educator for over ten years this started with my Dad being an alcoholic and as a result I abstain from drink and drugs, it is a requirement to be an Educator. I have also been employed by them to develop their youth division Generation Hope.

When I lived in Aylesbury I volunteered at a youth club, this



led to my career in youth work and

advocacy. Before I moved, I was Leader in Charge of seven youth clubs and one Specialist. When we moved to Hertfordshire, I was given keys to the youth-club in Westmill in my first week and was asked by the current Youth leader who was from the largest church in Hitchin to take the baton, which the Lord directed me to accept.

conference in Letchworth and God said, "It's time to use your experience again, you are ready." I have been a helpline volunteer for over 5 years.

I could not leave this piece without talking about pastoring and volunteering; it is my calling to help people.

Praise the Lord everyone, my name is Tracey-Ann Buckley. I have been part of the Bibleway Churches since I got baptised at Lewisham Church in 1991 along with my mum Deaconess Paulette Walker. Bishop White was our Pastor and he was a man who said that everyone should do something in church, even if it was just sweeping the floor. I was asked to help with the registration at Convocation in 1992/1993. In those days everyone was encouraged to pre-register, so I helped with typing badges for those who had preregistered in time for convocation and also helped on the registration desk.

I was approached one evening whilst I was at BTI in 2008 attending choir practice when Apostle McIntosh came out of one of the rooms and saw me and said, "You will do," I was dragged into the room. When I went in, I said, "I will do, for what?" He replied, "You can take the minutes." This was the first Convocation Planning Meeting that I attended. I muddled through the minutes as I had no idea who some of these people were, let alone what they were talking about. I must have done a good job as I have been taking the minutes of the Convocation Planning Meeting ever since. I have been the Church Secretary at True Vine Apostolic Ministries since April 2009.

I started working under the administration of Apostle McIntosh until Bishop Copeland was elected as the Diocesan Bishop in October 2010. I then

worked with the National Co-ordinator until she resigned in May 2019. I continued to work with Bishop Copeland until the election of Apostle McIntosh to Diocesan Bishop in October 2020, continuing to take the minutes of the Convocation Planning Meeting and maintaining the National Diary. On 5th January 2020 I was appointed to Deaconess by Bishop Williams-Silvera.

I was appointed as the National Administrator in May 2021. My day normally begins with reading and responding to emails and sending information via WhatsApp to the leaders where necessary. I generally have at least one to two meetings a week whether it is the: Togetherness Centre Management Meeting, Togetherness Centre Volunteers Meeting, Leaders Meeting, Pastors Meeting, Convention Planning Meeting or Women in Ministry Meeting. This involves taking minutes, sending them out and also reminders about the next meeting. I also help with the management of Zoom at these meetings and various other meetings i.e. United Service, Women's Day of Prayer and fasting, Revival Prayer and fasting and any other national meetings. I manage the National Diary and various other administrative duties for Apostle McIntosh whether it be sending reminders for meetings or carrying out research.

Focus on India's Women's Ministry

Praise the Lord! Greetings in Christ to you all, I am Aruna Damien from Bangalore-Karnataka in India. I am an officebearer- as Counsellor in our Women's group.



We are a group of 30 officebearers from four different districts in Karnataka, that is Bangalore, Tumkur, KGF, Chikkaballapur. We gather for fellowship on fourth Saturday of every month. A minimum number for each gathering will be about 300 women. The fellowship starts with an opening prayer and goes on with praise and worship, message and witness. We also have activity sessions that are different every month. These include: cooking competitions, singing competitions, Rangoli/ drawing competitions, debates

essay writing and more. We have counselling sessions for individuals and wind-up with closing prayer and some snacks. This is our monthly gathering for worship. However, due to the pandemic, we are conducting the meetings online via Google or Zoom.

Other than this, we office bearers will join hands together for other ministries every week.

First week of Every month -Hospital ministry. We will visit one hospital every month to strengthen the patients with prayers and also support them with food and medications.



Second week of every month - Jail ministry - We visit women and children prisoners to share the Word of GOD, counsel them and share some tracks with them.

Third week of Every Month -Orphanage Ministry - We visit orphanages and spend a full day involving kids to join in activities, praise and worship and birthday celebrations for children. We support them with their daily needs, clothing, books etc, especially girls personal care.

age Homes Ministry - Every fourth week of the month will be for the parents. We visit the old age people in their homes and spend our entire day with them, helping them with their work like cleaning their rooms, making their Aruna Damien beds, cloths etc. We also support them with clothing, bedding, and blankets etc.

So, this is all about our women's ministries.

Fourth Week of every month - **Old** I am grateful to thank every heart that is praying and supporting our ministry. I am requesting you all to support us and uphold our ministry in your daily prayers.

England in 1965 at 14 years old.

of travelling to India several times and once to Zimbabwe.

God has been so good to me throughout my life journey, he is passion and love for God. I prayed surely the good shepherd, he has never failed me yet.

> I am so grateful and thankful to God for sparing my life to see my 70th birthday. I love the Lord and I just want to praise him with every fibre of my being, for his mercies, his grace, his love, his power and might. In 1983 I accepted Jesus Christ as my personal saviour. I was baptised in Lewisham at the convention that year whilst attending



Bibleway Church, Cricklewood.

I got saved in Cricklewood (Bibleway Apostolic Pentecostal Church). At

the time I was living in Willesden Green where I served as the treasurer for the women's department. My Pastor at the time was the late Elder Barrows and his wife, Mother Barrows. I worshipped there for quite some time and later moved to Harrow because of a vision I received from the Lord. The journey to Harrow was not easy as the house I was buying fell through and at the time I had already got the children into school in Harrow so that meant I had to travel to Harrow and back over a period of time until I finally found a house.

One morning after taking my children to school I met a lady (Mrs Nurse), who enquired if I knew of a church she and her mother could attend; I knew it was God's will. I invited her to Cricklewood. Once a week we held prayer meetings at Mrs Nurses' and her daughter and son-in-law would attend. They were Christians but were baptised in the "Title." The son-in-law used to witness at Jubilee Clock in Harlesden.

After some time, a Pastor from Bible Way was appointed to pastor the church in Harrow that had now been formed. I continued attending the church assembly in Cricklewood on Sundays in the mornings and then attend the Harrow service in the afternoons. diligence and from my heart, My endeavour was to help organise and show the brethren how to prepare for the service. Mrs Nurse, her daughter and sonin-law got baptised in the name of Jesus and Mrs Nurse got filled with the Holy Spirit on her way out of the baptismal pool.

The Lord continued to use me in that I met a woman in the launderette whom I evangelised to; she later took up membership at the church. At the time I was a homecare worker and worked with Harrow Social Services. Eventually the late Bishop White sent Pastor Andrew Bailey to take over the Harrow Branch and to my knowledge it is still operating to this day, however, it was taken out of Bibleway.

Following on from there God laid it on my heart to buy pentecostal hymnals for the members of the church and so I was obedient,

and this led me to my next assignment which was to make chorus books with the help of Minister Cornell. It was challenging but I did it with knowing that my reward is with Jesus who loves me unconditionally and whom I love with all my heart.

My next mission was in Hemel and little did I know but it is not my will, but God's will! I moved to Hemel Hempstead in the Millennium and another church was birthed "Abundant Life Bibleway Church"


